



RECIPES

The following recipe is from Merlene Ryan. It's a wonderful salad that was enjoyed by all who had it. Thanks for sharing Merlene!

Winter Salad

Romaine (3-4 hearts) chopped up
2 or 3 Bartlett Pears, diced
3 apples, diced
Cashews, (salted) 1 cup (more or less, your preference)
Dried Cranberries ---1 cup (more or less, your preference)
Swiss Cheese – finely shredded, 6-8 oz

The original dressing suggested was Poppy Seed, but I used one bottle of Light Raspberry Vinaigrette and it was very good. (13 servings)

Shrimp Spread

1 can cream of mushroom soup, undiluted
3 Tbsp water
1 envelope Knox gelatin
Heat soup and water in saucepan and dissolve gelatin. Add remaining ingredients.
1 – 8 oz. Philadelphia cream cheese, softened (can use lite, but I didn't)
1 to 2 cans tiny shrimp (can use any amount fresh)
1 cup mayonnaise (can use lite)
1 cup celery cut up small
1 bunch green onions cut up small

Combine until thoroughly mixed. Chill in a mold or bowl overnight.

Serve with your favorite crackers. I use Keebler's Club Crackers.

TOLL BRIDGE TOLERS PLANNING MEETING MINUTES

First Lutheran Church, Concord, CA

January 8, 2012

Present: Darlene Smith, Roz Borgerson, Karen Vecchi, Liz Doran, Liz Little, Barbara Flavin, Connie Oakley, D. J. West, Jeanie Strech, Marianne Simpson, Shirley Irwin, Suzanne Olson, Bonnie Vernon, Barbara Bouchet, Vivian Roubal.

The meeting was called to order by President Karen Vecchi at 1:10 p.m. The meetings will continue to be held at First Lutheran Church on the third Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. The Board meetings will be held on the same day at 7:00 p.m. Karen advised the December meeting date is the 18th and it was agreed to have our annual Christmas dinner on that date.

Karen reviewed the SDP annual chapter questionnaire and received suggestions for its completion based on our activities in 2011. Chapter goals and special activities will be considered during the meeting.

Budget: Barbara Flavin distributed the 2011 actual budget to assist in establishing the 2012 budget.

Membership: Liz Little asked about charging a penalty for late membership dues payment. Jeanie reminded that the chapter agreed no penalty would be assessed. It was noted we need more members and younger members.

Programs: Connie Oakley advised she needs a budget amount this year for her upfront costs in relation to the bunny project each month. She noted the cost should be a wash with the money for the project transferring in and out as members pay each month.

Treasurer: Barbara Flavin plans to keep everyone aware of how much they spend during the year. She is changing the method used to track the budget costs by starting with the total amount allowed and subtracting what is spent during the year. It was noted the Treasurer's books need to be audited for the SDP report.

Newsletter: Marianne Simpson asked that her current budget remain the same. The postage is being raised to \$.45 on January 22. Shirley Irwin suggested she buy the Forever stamp and a sheet of extra postage before the rates increase.

Ways and Means: Vivian advised they made money this year and to leave the budget the same. Fund raisers this year will include bunko and election work if members are interested. Merlene will ask for election worker sign-ups. It was suggested we consider having a White Elephant sale at the BBQ in July. It was also suggested doing another quilt for a separate raffle at bunko with proceeds to go to an additional charity.

NCCC: D.J. West advised the deadline for submitting for teaching; theme or design for the Modesto conference is January 28. It will be held September 13-16, 2012. It will be possible to attend one day only this year. It was agreed to reimburse our chapter representatives for gas and bridge toll to the meetings and \$300 will be added to the budget for this purpose.

Handbook: Barbara Flavin asked that the budget be increased to \$130.

Seminars: Liz Doran suggested March for our earliest seminar/paint in. Liz Little advised the Martinez plumbers are consolidating with the Concord branch and the Plumbers' Hall may be sold. We will need to look for another location for our seminars, paint-ins and bunko. Several locations were suggested and individual members will check on the costs. Karen noted we have liability insurance through SDP. D. J. was asked to do a fabric painting project this year. Merlene and D.J. suggested the chapter consider a painting cruise on Carnival Lines. D.J. has been exploring the costs. There is a four day cruise to Catalina and Ensenada or a seven day cruise to Cabo San Lucas-Puerto Vallarta-Cabo San Lucas, both from the Los Angeles area. The costs depend on the number per room with no minimum number required. She will research this further. Suggestions for seminars/paint-ins in 2012 include asking Vicki Gardiner to return, Claudia Garcia (watercolor) and D.J.'s fabric painting project.

Rewards and Recognition: Tamara Mannon is planning something different this year and may need a budget increase.

County Fair: Marianne Simpson plans to do tote bags again and switch plates which were a big hit in 2011.

Community Projects: Roz Borgerson has contacted additional hospitals (John Muir, both locations, Kaiser and possibly infusion centers) for interest in receiving memory boxes and will explore all options. She noted it would not be a permanent commitment. Lucille Hart will continue with the County Hospital. Roz reported she and Lucille have several painted boxes available at this time. Roz will be purchasing additional boxes and asked that the budget remain the same.

Announcements: Karen received an email from National asking for interest in helping to paint 450 luggage tags as party favors for the Wichita convention. The Board was not interested in participating. Joanne's is sponsoring a "Social Artworking" promotion through Deco Art. It involves a two hour canvas painting project with two door prizes available. Karen will call for more information. Thank you notes were received from Blue Star Moms with a reception invitation and Independent Living Skills for the Chapter's donations.

The meeting adjourned at 3:15 p.m.

January 17, 2012

The meeting was called to order by President Karen Vecchi at 7:30 pm with a quorum present. The minutes of the November meeting as published in the December newsletter were approved as printed (Barbara Flavin/Roz Borgerson).

Treasurer's Report: A bounced check was returned by the bank with a \$10 service charge. Should the member involved be asked to reimburse the chapter? It was moved, seconded and approved that any bank fees incurred by the chapter will be reimbursed by the member (Jeanie Strech/Holly Yarberry).

Treasurer Barbara Flavin passed out budget information to the Board and chairpersons detailing the 2011 budget and expenditures and the 2012 proposed budget. She noted changes were indicated in the red boxes and negative amounts from 2011 were in red parentheses. A total of \$650 was added for the NCCC retreat this year. Also a line item for mileage and tolls for our NCCC representatives was added. \$50 was added for purchase of memory boxes. \$300 was added for facility rental for seminars as there is a change with the Plumbers' Hall and it may not be available any longer. Marianne Simpson, Darlene Smith and Shirley Irvin (via Liz Doran) brought information on various venues to consider. Karen Vecchi advised Shirley Irvin was recovering from knee surgery. A motion was made and seconded to approve the 2012 budget as adjusted (Holly Yarberry/Suzanne Olson). Approved.

Guest: Connie Oakley introduced Roz Reynolds whom she met at Joanne's. Roz indicated she wished to become a member of the chapter and was warmly welcomed.

Seminars: Liz Doran announced that D.J. West's fabric painting seminar will be held on March 17 or 24. The samples were displayed and members were asked to vote for their choice for the seminar. The votes were tallied and

the hummingbird pattern and Wish on a Star pattern were tied. It was agreed to have a salad potluck at the seminar.

D.J. West brought information on a possible Carnival painting cruise in October, 2013. The cruise would leave from the Los Angeles area to Catalina and Ensenada. Many members expressed interest and D.J. will obtain further information. Husbands, friends or others could also be invited.

2012 Charities: Karen asked that members bring information on their charities to the February meeting. She asked that they also determine the percentage of donations that go to administrative costs. Thank you notes were received from Independent Living Skills and the Blue Star Moms who also invited the chapter to their event in San Francisco. See Karen for further information.

Christmas Dinner: The third Tuesday falls on December 18 (a week before Christmas) and it was agreed to hold the Christmas dinner on that date. The location will be determined.

Membership: In Liz Little's absence a sign-up sheet was circulated for member attendance.

Ways and Means: Vivian reported on this year's bunko event noting that the same theme will be used as last year. She suggested the chapter do another quilt as a separate raffle prize. The winner need not be present to win. Several themes were suggested for the quilt; i.e., snowmen, Halloween, garden theme. It was suggested that 12 blocks be used representing each month of the year. These will be made available at the February meeting. No date has been set yet for the event but it is normally the third Saturday of August. Having a white elephant sale was brought up at the Planning Meeting and will be considered. Merlene Ryan reminded this is an election year and members are able to work on the election with proceeds to go to the chapter. Training is required and workers are paid for the training and working the election. Half day and full day schedules are available. She circulated a sign-up sheet.

County Fair: Marianne Simpson reported the fair is May 30 to June 2 this year. She encouraged entries from members. Registration may be done on line or by mail. You don't have to be a county resident to enter.
